Spotlight on Que: Brother Jason Cleavon Butler

Brother Butler readily speaks the courage of his convictions on a variety of topics including fraternity and sports. He is skilled at dancing and marching (stepping or hopping)



with great vigor and excitement. Butler espouses the fraternity's motto of Friendship is essential to the soul and his way of life aligns with the fraternity's charge of service to all mankind.

I met Brother Butler in 2004 through a mutual friend, Brother Earl Wilson, former International Executive Director, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Incorporated. I received an email informing me of Butler's move to the Mile High City; I called Butler immediately to connect as a friend and to welcome him to the city. Brother Butler graduated from Maplesville High School as the 3rd black Valedictorian in school's history; his twin graduated as the Salutatorian. Butler played football as a wide receiver and punt/kick-off coverage. He ran track as a member of the 4 x400m relay team.

Brother Butler was initiated into the Rho Gamma Chapter, Stillman College, Tuscaloosa, AL on February 18, 1995 as the 'Deuce' on a line of 17. Butler was a member of Psi Alpha Chapter, San Antonio TX, receiving their Omega Man of the Year Award. He became a member of Chi Phi Chapter and served as Keeper of Finance, FY 2017-2019. Butler has worked on a number of chapter committees: 80th Chapter Anniversary (Chairman); Social Action (Chairman); Achievement Week (Co-Chairman); Hospitality for NBA All-Star Game in Denver; Rites of Passage/Omega Leadership Academy; and as Denver Panhellenic Council Representative. Brother Butler is the recipient of several Chi Phi Chapter awards namely the Superior Service Award, Basileus Award and several Chapter Service Awards. Butler's aspiration for Omega Psi Phi is for the Fraternity to continue to be leaders of men not only the historically Divine Nine Black fraternities but to be leaders of all men of all races. His hope for Chi Phi is for the Chapter to continue to be the best chapter locally, in the state of Colorado, and in the Eighth District.
