
## **Spotlight on Que: Brother Orrin Lewis Ellis**

Brother Orrin Lewis Ellis aka 'O' or '2Q' is a man of God who values family and friends. Brother Ellis is smart, suave, steadfast, supportive, and sincere. He readily accepts others in a non-judgmental manner and his actions are congruent with his speech. Brother Ellis lives the four cardinal principles of Manhood, Scholarship, Perseverance and Uplift and the values will be used as an outline to share a segment of his journey.

Manhood: Brother Ellis was born and raised on the 'South Side' of Chicago, IL. He has one brother, Lieutenant Colonel Retired Chaplain John W. Ellis, III. Brother Ellis remembers the riots of 1968 when Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was killed and the city was on locked down by the Illinois National Guard with bayonets and tanks. Brother Ellis was 12 and terrified. He also recalls the rise of the Disciples and Blackstone Rangers gangs as a child and how cautious the kids had to be when walking to school or playing outside.



Brother Ellis is married to the lovely Heidi Casteel. There are five children in the family (Dr. Shimika Ellis, Siani Ellis, Omari Ellis, Devon Casteel, and Christopher Casteel) and six grandchildren (Miles Tatum, Mason Tatum, Royce James Casteel, Gavin Casteel, Thaddeus Lewis, and Joseph Walton).

Scholarship: Brother Ellis graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Finance and Insurance from Northwest Missouri State University, Maryville, MO, August 1972. He received a scholarship in 1970 from the Alpha Phi Omega Service Fraternity. Ellis was a Resident Assistant at a dorm facility which housed only Omega Lampados.

Uplift: Brother Ellis is a member of Cure D'Ars Catholic Church in Denver and he has served as Saturday Services Scripture Lector since 2014. Ellis was previously a member of the St. Louis Catholic Church, Kansas City, MO; he was appointed as the Eucharistic Minister and Services Lector (1991-2004), Pastoral Council (1998-2004), and Finance Council (2006-2013). Ellis was elected as Vice Chairman of the Finance Council (2010-2013). Brother Ellis was an active member with the Knights of Peter Claver for 21 years. He has held several local and regional leadership positions in the organization. Ellis was a member of Kansas City, MO Council #265 (1991-2012) and held the role of Treasurer, Council #265 (1998-2006). He was elected as the Grand Knight of Council #265 (2008-2010) and the Treasurer, Central States District (2010-2014). Brother Ellis is a thespian and he has acted in a few church productions, such as, the lead role of Troy Maxson in the play "Fences" by August Wilson (St. Louis Catholic Church, 2008), the lead role of Joseph in the Christmas Pageant (Cure D'Ars Catholic Church, 2016), and the lead role of Pontius Pilate in the Easter Play Pageant (Cure D'Ars Catholic Church, 2017).

Brother Ellis has served in the community as a member of the Board of Directors, Turner House Community Center, Kansas City, KS (1975-1981), member of Board of Directors, Stratford Homes Homeowners Association (HOA), Kansas City, MO (2006-2014), and elected South East Kansas City Region Representative of Kansas City HOA Neighborhood Advisory Council, Kansas City, MO (2010 & 2012).

In Omega, Brother Ellis is a recipient of the 50 Year Service Award which was given in July 2020 at the 82nd Grand Conclave (Virtual). He was initiated into Omega Psi Phi on December 5, 1970 through the Iota Sigma Chapter, Northeast Missouri State University at Kirksville, MO; he was the 'Deuce' on a line of four and his line name was 'Duck' on the 'Ujama' or 'The Family' line. Brother Ellis' line introduced and influenced Black Greek life and culture on the campus at NW Missouri State. He grew up personally knowing the 29th Grand Basileus Judge Marion Garnett; Ellis' mother worked for Judge Garnett as his Chicago office staff supervisor. Brother Ellis would frequently go to the office and interact with Brother Garnett after school and weekends. In addition, Ellis grew up personally knowing the 2nd Vice Grand Basileus Thomas A. Lassiter. Brother Ellis lived next door in Kansas City to Brother Lassiter growing up and developed a 60 year 'father-son & relationship having dated his oldest daughter and taking her to his Senior Prom. Brother Lassiter was also Ellis' little league baseball coach and became Godfather to his son until Brother Lassiter's passing into Omega Chapter.
