Smith grew up as an Army brat and he lived on the following military bases: Ft Hood, TX; Mannheim, Germany; Fort Benning, GA; Fort Campbell KY; and, Denver, CO. While in Denver, Smith attended Smiley Jr. High School and graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School in 1978. Brother Smith and his wife, Shelia have been married for 38 years having met in college; they have three children (Candice, Chere & Jeffrey II) and two grandsons (Elijah and Emmanuel). Brother Smith is grateful for his family and is proud of his children's accomplishments and life's pursuits.

Scholarship: Brother Smith graduated Cum Laude from Lane College, Jackson, TN with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business. While at Lane, Smith was president of the Student Government Association (1981-82) and a member of Students in Free Enterprise (SIFE). Brother Smith is Life Member #107 of the Lane College National Alumni Association.

Perseverance: Professionally, Brother Smith retired recently from TIAA, a fortune 100 financial services company. Over his 25 year career, Smith supported customers with retirement and financial planning via phone, in person, letter, and email. He led and coached employees while serving in contact center operations, outbound sales, written (letter) correspondence, email operations, and business readiness. Smith has a vast skill-set ranging from customer service, sales, problem resolution, coaching, and lean sigma process improvement. He is the recipient of four awards at TIAA: National Contact Center (NCC) Diversity & Inclusion Manager of the Year for Denver (2016); NCC Above and Beyond Award (2011); Mass Market Star Performer Award (2005); and, TIAA-CREF Excellence in Consulting Services (2000).

Militarily, Brother Smith served in the United States Army (1LT, Field Artillery) for nearly seven years. He was stationed at the following bases: Fort Leonard Wood, MO; Fort Benjamin Harrison, IN; Fort Wainwright, AK; Fort Benning, GA; and, Fort Sill, OK. Smith completed Primary Leadership Development Course, Officer Candidate School, Airborne School, Basic Artillery Officer Course, and the Lance Missile Course. He received the Army Commendation Award, Army Achievement Medal, and the Field Artillery Association's Honorable Order of Saint Barbara Award.

Uplift: Personally, Brother Smith is a member of the Rising Star Missionary Baptist Church, the Reverend Dr. Jules E. Smith, Pastor; he has served in the Male Chorus and Brotherhood. Brother Smith is a Distinguished Toastmaster (DTM), Toastmasters International's highest level and recognition for leadership and communications. In 2005, he was named Area Governor of the Year in the Denver Division for exhibiting leadership, presentation skills, club coaching, and member development. In 2002, he received the Toastmaster of the Year Award for Area D4. Smith was a 20 year member of TIAA Speakers In Action Club, serving as president several times. Brother Smith is also a member and past president of the Owl Club of Denver. He is a financial member of the Aurora Branch-NAACP and the American Legion. Smith is a recipient of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.'s 2014 MODEL (Man of Distinction, Excellence and Leadership) Man of the Year Award. Through the years, Brother Smith has been a passionate advocate for community service projects, social action programs, and membership development initiatives. In 1989, he helped establish Chi Phi Chapter's participation in the Brothers Redevelopment Incorporated's Paint-a-thon, a program serving senior citizens with home painting and yard maintenance. The chapter has painted nearly 40 homes in 31 consecutive years.
